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## **Radnor Park Clear Out Day**

Clydebank Housing Association (CHA) held its 10th community clear-out day at Radnor Park on 15 September and tenants took advantage of this great opportunity to get rid of unwanted items in the lovely Autumn sunshine.

This year was the biggest clear out to date and we await exact weight and recycling figures from West Dunbartonshire Council's Waste Services Department. Sunshine Electrical also came along and took away a great number of electrical items to reuse or recycle. The recycling element tied in perfectly with it being Scottish Housing Day, the theme of which was Climate Emergency.

Joe Farrell, Head of Housing Services at Clydebank Housing Association, said, *"Our Radnor Park Multi Storeys flats (MSF) are unique within our housing stock with 400 households living in a relatively small area. A significant number of our residents are also over the age of 65 which, coupled with the challenging internal layouts within a MSF block, mean disposal of large or bulky items is a challenge or even impossible. This has led to CHA, in conjunction with the Radnor Park Multis Tenants and Residents Association (RPMTRA), organising clear-out days like this for residents. This year's is of particular significance in light of not only these factors, but the pandemic lockdowns making disposal of items impossible for large periods of the last year"*.

CHA extended huge thanks to their on-site caretakers and office staff who rolled up their sleeves and got stuck in to assist tenants and to the RPMTRA for their help.
